

Ed Leadership Teach-Out Advising Plan

Introduction

Students in this program are broadly in two groups: those currently completing the Administrative Service Credential (ASC) Program who will begin EDEL MA specific coursework this fall, and continuing/returning EDEL MA students. For this MA program, a majority of the units completed during the ASC Credential Program (24 units) form the foundation of the MA coursework. MA students need 9 additional units beyond the ASC coursework.

- Majors in closing programs will receive priority registration and are **strongly** encouraged to register on April 14.
- Additional General Education course options will become available on July 1, and additional non-GE courses will become available beginning August 1 through [CSU Fully Online](#).

Advising for ALL EDEL MA Students:

All EDEL MA students will be given *priority registration* for Fall 2025 and Spring 2026. Review your ARR before registration begins. If you have questions about what to take, please meet with your advisor early.

- If not already completed, register for EDSP 571 **in Fall 2025**.
- If not already completed and in the thesis pathway, register for EDMS 597 in Fall 2025 or Spring 2026.
- Select your thesis/cognate chair in the 2025-26 academic year. Work with that faculty chair to plan your project/thesis including the timeline for the project and required elements such as GSO1 and GSO2 and EDSP 599.
- Apply to graduate no later than Spring 2027.

Advising for students currently in the ASC Program starting EDEL MA coursework in Fall 2025:

These students have 9 remaining units as outlined below. Each pathway involves the Research Paradigms Course (EDSP 571) and a Supervised Research Course (EDSP 599). The third course varies by pathway and is an elective for the cognate pathway and a portfolio and proposal presentation course for thesis students. All 9 of these units and associated requirements (GSO1 and GSO2) must be fully completed by Spring 2027.

Cognate Pathway Core Courses (9 units)

- EDSP 571: Research Paradigms in Education (3 units)
- One Elective TBD with the Program Advisor (minimum 3 units)
- EDSP 599: Supervised Study for Cognate Project (3 units)

Thesis Pathway Core Courses (9 units)

- EDSP 571: Research Paradigms in Education (3 units)
- EDMS 597: Portfolio and Proposal Preparation (3 units)
- EDSP 599: Supervised Research for Thesis/Project (3 units)

As part of their conditional admission, students in this group will be required to take EDSP 571 in Fall 2025 and for thesis pathway students, EDSP 597 within the 25-26 academic year. This then allows students up to two additional semesters in academic year 26-27 to complete their cognate or thesis. In regards to EDSP 599, students may select

a chair from any faculty within the School of Teacher Education and Leadership (SOTEL) or another department on campus with permission from the SOTEL Chair.

Advising for returning EDEL MA students:

These students have up to 9 remaining units as outlined above. Most students are simply working to complete their thesis or cognate. Students in this group must be enrolled in a course at SSU and complete all course requirements and associated requirements (GSO1 and GSO2) by Spring 2027. Students should work with their faculty advisor on their specific course requirements and graduation timeline.
